- **Prostate:** MUSIC recently developed a new and improved Patient Reported Outcomes (PRO) for Radical Prostatectomy physician trend report. - **ROCKS:** In our continued efforts to decrease post-URS ED visits through patient education, we are excited to announce our first-ever MUSIC ROCKS patient education video! This patient education video was developed in partnership with the Urology Care Foundation and is designed to equip patients with the knowledge and understanding of what to expect with a ureteral stent. - **KIDNEY:** The KIDNEY team is preparing for a skills workshop focused on robotic partial nephrectomy. MUSIC urologists are invited to submit a video of one (or more) partial nephrectomies for de-identified peer review. The main goal is to facilitate peer mentoring to raise the quality of care patients receive, especially reducing the positive surgical margin rate, and bleeding complications. We hope you will consider submitting a video and participating in the workshop as we continue our efforts to improve outcomes for patients with small renal mass diagnoses across Michigan.
