<p><b>Pre-stented</b> Stone size: &lt; 15mm</p>	<p><b>Case Type:</b> Uncomplicated URS*  <b>Stone Location:</b> Kidney or Ureter  <b>UA/Urine Culture:</b> Negative  <b>Residual Fragments:</b> Small or None  <b>Access Sheath Use:</b> No  <b>Dilation:</b> No</p>
<p><b>Not Pre-Stented</b> Stone size: ≤ 10mm</p>

# Stent Omission Appropriateness Criteria

## \*Uncomplicated URS criteria as defined by the MUSIC ROCKS Stent Panel

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| <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Age <math>\geq 18</math> years</li> <li>• American Society of Anesthesiologists (ASA) score <math>&lt; 3</math></li> <li>• Not immunocompromised</li> <li>• No pregnancy</li> <li>• No evidence of functional/anatomic solitary kidney</li> <li>• No anatomic abnormalities (i.e. stricture, UPJ obstruction, horse shoe kidney)</li> </ul> | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• No urinary tract reconstruction</li> <li>• No uncorrected bleeding diathesis</li> <li>• No history of neurogenic bladder or incomplete bladder emptying</li> <li>• No signs or symptoms of sepsis</li> <li>• No history of sepsis associated with urinary tract infection</li> <li>• No untreated positive urine culture</li> </ul> | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• No stones in multiple locations (i.e. both ureter and kidney)</li> <li>• Stone size <math>\leq 15</math>mm</li> <li>• Operative time <math>\leq 60</math> minutes</li> <li>• No balloon dilation of the ureter</li> <li>• Unilateral procedure</li> <li>• No plan for second look procedure</li> <li>• Retrograde URS only</li> <li>• No ureteral perforation or trauma</li> </ul> |
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
